### “Get Out and Go Hike”

Tuesday Evening at Taylorsville Metro Park  
2101 U.S. 40 - East of Taylorsville Dam

Two Start times - Join Sharon for one or both loops:  
4:20 - Fast pace - 5:20 - Slower pace second time around

Join Sharon M and members of the Miami Valley Outdoor Club for a brisk Tuesday hike at Taylorsville MetroPark. This fast-paced hike through hilly wooded terrain and along the Great Miami River lasts about an hour. Hike begins promptly at 4:20. Meet at the parking lot near the CCC shelter off Route 40.

The orange trail has a closed section so Sharon is going to do 2 modified loops on the Orange trail. At the 4:20 start she will be leading the brisk pace hike. The group will be back at the CCC shelter by 5:20. A second, slower paced hike around the orange trail again will start at 5:20. You may want a head lamp if you come at 5:20 and do the slower loop. It will take about 1 hour 15+ minutes for the second loop. There are many options if you want to do a shorter and/or slower loop

April 6, 13, 20 and 27. Hope to see you there.

### Wednesday Nite Bike Hikes

Grossnickle/Englewood/Aullwood Loop  
5:00 p.m., April 7, 14, 21 & 28

MVOCer Lindy McDonough will lead this evening bike ride from Jake Grossnickle Memorial Park to and through Englewood MetroPark, past Aullwood Audubon Center and Marie Aull's Garden to Meeker Rd. and back to Grossnickle Park. The ride will wind through fields, woods, past fishing lakes, over Englewood Dam and along Englewood Lake, past a former riding stable and the famous Buckhorn Tavern for approximately 8-10 miles, lasting about 1.5 hours.

There will be some great downhill opportunities as well as a few uphill grades that we will either ride or walk up. This moderately paced ride may be a struggle in a few places the first time out, but if you make it to all four trips, you should be in good shape by the end of the series. We will be on recreational trails about two thirds of the trip, briefly on U.S. Rt 40 and the rest on less traveled back roads. Wear bright colors.

Directions to Grossnickle Park: From U.S. 48 at first traffic light just south of Meijer and Samaritan North, turn east on Heath Cliff Rd.
